

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Don Yoshino is principal of Yoshino Architecture, located in Boca Raton, Florida. Following a graduate program in Japanese architectural history at Kyoto University, he became project manager for DMJM Tokyo, and then vice president-in-charge of the international division at PAE International. Yoshino received his AIA Service to Society fellowship as former president of the Board of Trustees at the Morikami Museum and Japanese Gardens, where he assisted in the seven-year development of the award-winning Rojien Gardens. In 2017 he was conferred the Order of the Rising Sun, Gold and Silver Rays from the Foreign Ministry of Japan for his continuous work in bridging the culture between Japan and the United States.

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Andrew Wit is a founder of the interdisciplinary research group WITO*, Laboratory for Intelligent Environments, and co-editor of the forthcoming book "Towards a Robotic Architecture." He is also an assistant professor of Digital Practice within Temple University's Division of Architecture and Environmental Design, where he leads research and teaching focused on novel building systems generated through the integration of lightweight composites, digital tools/fabrication, and robotics.





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

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

VLADIMIR SLAPETA

Brno, Czech Republic



Architect and urban planner Vladimír Šlapeta ranks among the leading Czech modern architecture historians and theoreticians. Šlapeta studied architecture at the Czech Technical University in Prague and led the department of architecture at the National Technical Museum in Prague for almost twenty years.

Šlapeta has a particular interest in Brno Functionalism, propagating it abroad from the 1980s in the form of exhibitions and publications, and is a member of a range of international research institutions and the author of dozens of publications on Czech modern architecture. Šlapeta was made an honorary fellow of the American Institute of Architects in 1992.



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


